Annual Town Election – May 6, 2025

The Annual Town Election is scheduled for Tuesday, May 6. This is an important opportunity for you to vote on local issues and elect town officials. More details are provided at the Clerk's Corner on page 4 of the newsletter.

Remote Meetings Extended

On March 28, Gov. Maura Healey signed a bill to extend authorizations for local boards and committees to hold public meetings remotely or in a hybrid format through June of 2027. The law also permits reduced quorums for Open Town Meetings. The remote and hybrid authorizations under the state's open meeting law were created as emergency accommodations during the COVID-19 pandemic and had been extended due to their success but were due to expire on March 31, 2025.

Many of Westford's Boards and Committees either meet in a hybrid format or totally remotely. For those Boards and Committees with this option, residents can find instructions and links to participate remotely on the agenda located on our website.

2025 Townwide Paving Program

The Town of Westford is launching its 2025 Townwide Paving Program to improve road conditions and enhance driving safety. A total of 33 roads will be resurfaced — 20 funded through the town's paving budget and 13 at no cost to taxpayers through a mitigation agreement with Newport Construction, the low bidder. Roads were selected based on pavement condition, traffic volume, and the need for drainage and safety improvements. From the Select Board

The Select Board is committed to ensuring the safety and well-being of our citizens, providing a high quality education for our children, managing growth, maintaining the town infrastructure, and protecting the town's valued environmental and historic resources, all in a fiscally responsible manner.



March 11, 2025 - Select Board Meeting Highlights:

The Select Board approved the acceptance and layout of Diane Lane, set the early voting schedule for the May 6 Town Election, and continued advocacy efforts for a previous Town Meeting article. Contracts were awarded for paving, catch basin cleaning, and street sweeping to support spring infrastructure projects. The Board also took a moment to celebrate the achievements of the WA Robotics Club and highlighted upcoming community events.

March 25, 2025 - Select Board Meeting Highlights:

The Select Board approved several requests, including a Common Victualler's License for Little Town Coffee and a special license for a wine and beer tasting event at St. Catherine's Parish Center. The Board also approved plans for the Apple Blossom Parade, Memorial Day Services, and the Westfest event, as well as a bench installation at Jack Walsh Field to honor Dr. Andreas Athanasiou.

Key actions included authorizing agreements for regional collaboration with the Town of Chelmsford and NMCOG, as well as submitting a Green Communities grant application. The Board also approved contracts and purchase orders for water treatment, road maintenance, and vehicle acquisitions, ensuring continued investment in town infrastructure.

Additionally, the Select Board congratulated Firefighter/EMT Shawn Ricard on his retirement after 38 years of service, celebrated the Westford Academy Girls' Cross Country Team's State Championship, and expressed appreciation for the efforts of first responders during a recent search and rescue operation for a missing woman.

Voter registration deadline – Friday, April 25, 2025

Voter Registration Options:

When registering to vote, you may:

- Register in a Political Party – Select Democratic or Republican (current options).
- Register in a Political Designation – Choose from a list of recognized political designations.
- Register with No Party Affiliation – Select "No Party (Unenrolled)," commonly referred to as independent (no party designation).

Important Notes:

- Unenrolled voters (independent) may vote in state and presidential primaries by selecting a party ballot but will remain unenrolled.
- Registered party members (Democratic or Republican) may only vote in their respective party's primary.
- In general elections, all voters receive the same ballot regardless of party enrollment.

Electric Aggregation Program Update

Westford's Power Options Program (POP) provides town-vetted electricity supply options with competitive rates and additional renewable energy choices. The current contract ends in late 2025, and the Town will go out to bid for renewal this spring. Three options will remain available: POP Standard (with 10% extra renewable energy), POP Gold (100% renewable), and POP Basic (state-required renewables). Learn more at masscea.com/Westford.

Why are the flags at half-staff?

Have you noticed the flag at half-staff on the Town Common or municipal buildings and wondered why?

The Governor of Massachusetts issues directives for flying the U.S. and Commonwealth flags at half-staff—usually to honor the passing of federal, state, or local officials, or Massachusetts military personnel. The Town of Westford follows these official directives and notifies staff responsible for managing flag displays on town-owned properties.

Residents and local businesses are encouraged to participate by lowering their flags, if they choose.



With irrigation season approaching, the Westford Water Department urges early water conservation. Stage II outdoor water use restrictions will take effect **May 1, 2025**. Significant spring rain may help, but for now, please limit non-essential outdoor water use.







The Battles of Lexington & Concord, April 18-19, 1775: The Start of a Revolution

"Before we had gone half a mile, we were fired on from all sides."

Thursday, April 10, at 7 p.m., Westford Museum, 2 Boston Road, Westford



The Battles of Lexington and Concord erupted on April 19, 1775, pitting the brave Massachusetts militia against the formidable British forces. This confrontation followed the dramatic Midnight Rides and the urgent Lexington Alarm, which mobilized the countryside in preparation for the impending advance of British troops toward Concord. Tensions reached a breaking point when British soldiers opened fire on the steadfast Lexington militia, igniting the sparks of the American Revolutionary War and ushering in a new era of struggle for independence. Join Tom Tringale as he recounts the events of April 18-19, 1775—the start of a revolution.

Annual Town Meeting Approves Robinson School Building Feasibility Study

This approval allows the Robinson School Building Committee (RSBC) to continue working with the Massachusetts School Building Authority (MSBA) to advance the next steps in the process. The immediate focus will be on hiring an Owner's Project Manager (OPM) to oversee the feasibility study. This phase involves a series of meetings, documentation, and approvals, with completion expected by July 2025. We will continue to provide regular updates throughout this process in order to keep everyone informed as well as posting all of the supporting information on the [RSBC website](#).



Strategic District Improvement Plan Update

As we continue in year two of our Strategic District Improvement Plan (SDIP), the progress update along with the [Action Plan for Year 3](#) has been shared with the School Committee. The current SDIP was developed to help guide WPS from 2023-2026 and next year will include steps to develop the next plan for 2027-2030. The SDIP informs the work that we are doing collaboratively as a district and the development of all of our individual School Improvement Plans (SIP). Each building principal will be presenting the FY26 SIPs to the School Committee in May.
