**Dear Westford residents,**

The Board of Selectmen recently formed a task force to assist with the coordination of missions and programming between the new Mill Works (sporting complex), our town's Recreation Department and the Community Center in the Roudenbush buildings, to examine and make recommendations to avoid overlap and redundancy in programming. The group includes members of the Parks and Recreation Commission, Board of Selectmen, Finance Committee, Recreation Department, The Roudenbush Community Center Inc., Mill Works staff, and residents-at-large.

One of the hallmarks to the start of summer in our town is Memorial Day weekend, and this year's observation continued Westford's tradition of honoring those who have died while serving in the armed forces. The parade on Sunday before the official holiday memorializes the sacrifices of our departed veterans and their families. Thank you to everyone who participated in the events and attended the festivities, and a special thanks to Terry Stader, our town's Veterans Service Officer, for organizing the entire program.



The Board of Selectmen has called a Special Town Meeting next month on Monday, July 10, 2017, at 7:30PM, in the Abbot School gymnasium, located at 25 Depot Street. This Town Meeting is required for two purposes: the Permanent Town Building Committee's need for additional funding necessary to complete the construction of the combined dispatch center; and the School Committee's request for a Massachusetts School Building Authority required vote for funding a Schematic Design Study for a potential partial or full roof replacement project at the Abbot Elementary School. Although the meeting will have a very brief warrant, a quorum of 200 registered town voters is required to begin the meeting, so please attend if you are able. You may also mark your calendars for our fall Special Town Meeting which is scheduled for Monday, October 16, 2017, at 7:30PM, located at the Abbot School gymnasium. The Board of Selectmen opened the warrant on June 13<sup>th</sup>, and the article submission deadline and warrant closing date is Tuesday, September 12, 2017, at noon.

The next regular meeting of the Board of Selectmen is cancelled for June 27, 2017 due to a lack of quorum by its members. Therefore, the next regular meeting is scheduled for July 11, 2017.

After hearing abutter's reactions to plans for the installation of a stop light at the Dunstable Road intersection at Groton Road, the Town Manager's Office will be working with the Engineering Department, Highway Department, Police Department, the Northern Middlesex Council of Governments (NMCOG) planning agency, and the residents to determine if there are alternative solutions to make the intersection safer. You may notice that we are in the process of having the exterior painted on the Cameron Senior Center in Forge Village. The work should be done by August and will help keep this historic gem of our town looking beautiful.

The promise of ice cream and friendly faces brought a great turnout to this year's Strategic Planning Retreat held annually at Kimball Farms. The event drew 268 residents, town officials, town staff, and visitors who attended and participated in discussions concerning healthy communities, pedestrian safety and recreational marijuana. There were also presentations provided by the Economic Development Committee, Cultural Council, Agricultural Commission, Dog Park Task Force, Town Manager's Office for capital projects, and the 12 North Main Street Task Force. It is always wonderful to see the comradery and constructive dialogue between residents and town staff.

The Westford Fire Department recently trained with PanAm Railroad to learn of safety features and other factors pertaining to locomotives and tank cars. Firefighters from Chelmsford and Littleton were also invited. A training evaluation was incorporated in the occasion to boost the readiness of town's emergency personnel.



### Summer Reading Programs





## Health Department

As the heating season draws to a close, many of us look to shut off the heater and break out the fans and Air Conditioners. Here are some tips to help keep you cooler and do it more efficiently.

- Prior to using air conditioners and fans, inspect and clean all fan blades and filters.
- Set your thermostat at as high a temperature as comfortably possible in the summer, and ensure humidity control if needed. The smaller the difference between the indoor and outdoor temperatures, the lower your overall cooling bill will be.
- Avoid setting your thermostat at a colder setting than normal when you turn on your air conditioner. It will not cool your home any faster and could result in excessive cooling and, therefore, unnecessary expense.
- Consider using an interior fan along with your window air conditioner to spread the cooled air through your home without greatly increasing your power use.
- Avoid placing appliances that give off heat such as lamps or TVs near a thermostat.
- Be sure your house is receiving plenty of fresh outside air to be sure your indoor air quality is good!

Experience the nature our town offers: over 2,000 acres of conserved land and over sixty miles of trails. There are trails for everyone: young, old, athletic, contemplative. Come explore!

#### 1) Bruce Freeman Rail Trail (♿)

1.8 mi. in Westford; paved, wide, and flat  
Find out more at [brucefreemanrailtrail.org](http://brucefreemanrailtrail.org)  
This well-shaded former rail line stretches from Lowell through Westford and is ideal for walking, running, biking, snowshoeing, and for strollers.

#### 2) Grassy Pond Life Course & Trail (Easy)

Intersection of Villanova Dr and Plain Rd  
0.5 mi. loop + side trails; wide, flat, stroller-friendly\*  
The loop around the pond is sprinkled with exercise stations and a geocache, and is popular with dog-walkers. Look for pink lady slipper flowers

#### 3) Slifer Conservation Land (Easy)


Entrance on Keyes Rd, between Wing & Gould Rds  
~1.0 mi. figure-eight loop; flat and wide  
Take a picnic along on this short trail and find the garden steps to Keyes Pond, a tiny foot bridge, and enormous rhododendrons (blooming in early June).

#### 4) Cider Mill Pond (Moderate)

Entrance on Lowell Rd, between Barn Ln & Stony Brook Rd  
0.5-1.0 mi. trails; varied elevation, uneven terrain  
Explore this gorgeous shady trail network: find the "Indian Grinding Stone" and the old cider mill

#### 5) Kissacook Hill Trails (Moderate)

Entrance behind Day School, 185 N Main St  
1.0 mi. loop; sometimes narrow, uneven terrain  
Wildflowers and birds abound on this trail, and the white birches are spectacular in autumn. The view up

Entrances at Trailside Way & Texas Rd  
1.5 mi. loop + side trails; narrow & rocky, mostly flat  
Explore more than 500 acres! See Nashoba Pond, glacial boulders, wetlands, wildlife, and wildflowers.

#### 7) Greystone Pond (Easy)

Entrance near Greystone Fields, off Russell's Way  
2.0 mi.; stroller-friendly\* in parts, then narrow  
Circumnavigate the pond or take some of the side trails into the woods, and be sure to look for the

#### 8) Stone Arch Trail (Easy)

Entrance on Cold Springs Rd, between Forge Village Rd & Pine Ridge Rd  
0.7 mi.; wide, stroller-friendly\*  
Walk to the iconic Stone Arch Bridge, traverse half-mile meandering side trails, including Russell Bird Sanctuary, and spot the abundant wildlife.

#### 9) Tom Paul Trail (Moderate)

Main entrance across from Town Hall, at 55 Main St  
3.0 mi.; narrow, crosses streets, varied elevation  
Stretching from Cold Spring Road to Town Hall, this trail features wetlands, streams, old stone walls, and is

#### 10) Stony Brook Conservation (Moderate)

Main entrance at intersection of Plain & Depot Rds  
1.75 mi. pond loop; wide variability  
A network of trails, including the beautiful loop around Burge's Pond and the trail along Stony Brook, makes this town favorite perfect for hiking, dog-walking, fishing, and more.

#### An Alert from the Westford Recycling Commission:


Westford's recycling vendor Republic Services will strictly enforce the town's policy NOT to accept recycling in plastic bags whether in or out of the receptacle.

## Flag Day - 2017



A Flag Day and Old Glory Retirement service took place at the Nab American Legion Post 437 on Dunstable Rd on Wednesday, June 14th. A very meaning full service was held to recognize the history of the flag of the United States. Fitting tributes and poems were read prior to the solemn destruction of the worn and tattered flags.
